

PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

In *The Rocket Men*, which you're about to see, the conversations are imagined, the timeline and all historical events are real. But how did *The Rocket Men* come to be?

In 2017, the head of the theater department at Athens State University, Hugh Long flew me down to Decatur, Alabama to see *Geek* a play of mine he was directing. While out there, he asked me to consider writing something we could explore for a commission to share in Alabama. While there, I did what most folks do in that region (which is just outside Huntsville or "Rocket City"), I went to the U.S. Space and Rocket Center. In the gift shop, I picked up a book totally by random. It was titled: The Rocket Team by Frederick L. Ordway III and Mitchell Sharpe. I began to read about Wernher von Braun and his Rocket Team. But who was von Braun? My mom knew him as the handsome silver-haired gentleman on TV; many people in America knew of him through the Tom Lehrer song. But many people like me, didn't seem to know him at all...and then I realized it had to do with Operation Paperclip which brought his team, which pioneered V2 technology, here in secret after WWII.

At the same time I discovered an article about Heinz-Hermann Koelle, a German rocketeer who was 13 years younger, brought over to be a part of the team in Huntsville several years later. Despite being a major player in the group, he is barely known "in the history books" and leaves the project in 1965. And I began to ask why....at the same time I dug deeper into the work of Michael J. Neufeld (Von Braun: Dreamer of Space, Engineer of War) and Dora by Jean Michel. And this play fell into place.

Five years later, as I began to speak about the play - three theaters saw the importance forming a National New Play Network Rolling World Premiere. This production is the second on that journey.

From the start I wanted an audience to be confronted with the fact that those actors didn't look anything like these figures in history were playing these roles. To own it. The fact that the play is called *The Rocket Men* and six woman enter and take the stage to tell this story... you're already asking "Why?" In my research, you will discover just as I did why. It was the last part of the story I learned.

We see a star, we take in the light that came from the star years ago. We look up, we are seeing what stars looked like years ago. Five years ago I read the book The Rocket Team by Frederick L. Ordway III and Mitchell Sharpe and it as like my heart took off like a rocket... but I didn't know the full story. Now, I hope in discovering it for yourself, you can find your own hope for the future, and how you see it.



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I'm not quite sure when I learned about the Holocaust, but I knew in my house we were always very careful not to waste.

It might have been when my normally-quiet and mild-mannered grandfather yelled at my sister as she cut the tops off strawberries – she cut too much and he couldn't bear it. I am first-generation American. My grandfather, an engineer, was taken to the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp during WWII. Thankfully he survived until the camp was liberated at the end of the war, when he re-united with my young mom and the rest of the family and

ultimately emigrated to Montreal.

I have always been fascinated by stories from this moment in history, particularly how the experience reverberates down through generations. How my life, in some ways so far removed, is still influenced by the actions of this time. This play invites us to explore those reverberations, to unearth the stories which haven't been told, and to make space for lives not acknowledged. It also invites us to grapple with the complexity of history and our own complicity within it.

The Rocket Men urges us to meet the ripples of history in

this moment in time, and to continue to engage, to bridge, and to heal


